# Overview

- High Winds and falling snow could lead to low visibilities
  - Sunday evening through Monday
- **Winter Storm Watch in effect**
  - **Sunday Night through Monday evening**
- **Potential Blizzard conditions across the Panhandles**



# What are the main concerns

- **High Winds**
  - 25 to 35 mph gusting up to 50
- **Ice on Roads**
  - Dry powdery snow, even small amounts, could turn to ice as cars travel on it
- **Blowing Snow/Low Visibilities**
  - Powdery snow can easily blow around and dramatically reduce visibilities


## High Impact Winter Storm Expected


### Impacts:

# Confidence

- **Precipitation Type – High**
  - High confidence for snow for much of the event
- **Snowfall Amounts – Low but increasing**
  - Models still not in agreement on storm track
- **Timing – Moderate**
  - Could start as early as Sunday afternoon or could hold off until Sunday night
- **Chance of precipitation – High**
  - Best chance for heaviest snow is in the Eastern half of the Panhandles
- **Winds – High**
  - Strong Northerly winds of 25 to 35 mph with gusts up to 50 mph behind the front on Sunday evening
