Advisories

This section provides links to all types of SIGMETs and AIRMETs, as well as International SIGMETs.

Forecasts

Every type of aviation forecast for any site across the US can be found in this section. Some of the available forecasts include Area Forecasts, Convection, Turbulence, Icing, and TAFs.

Observations

This is where you will find current weather conditions across the country. This data is displayed through PIREPs, METARs, Radar, and Satellite.

Aviation forecasts issued by The National Weather Service:

TAFs: Terminal Aerodrome Forecasts (TAFs) contain information for a 5-mile radius around specific airports. They are issued 4 times a day, amended as needed, and are valid for a 24-hour period.

TWEBs: Transcribed Weather Enroute Broadcasts (TWEBs) contain forecast information for a 50-nautical mile wide zone along a route and for selected terminal areas. They are broadcast over Telephone Information Briefing Service (TIBS).

Aviation forecasts issued by the Aviation Weather Center (Kansas City, MO):

SIGMETs: Significant Weather Information (SIGMETs) are issued as needed to warn of hazardous conditions such as severe icing or turbulence, dust storms, sandstorms, and volcanic ash.

CONVECTIVE SIGMETs: issued hourly for thunderstorms in the contiguous US.

AIRMETs: Airmen's Meteorological Information (AIRMETs) are issued routinely to warn of less severe conditions which may be hazardous.

Wind & Temperature Aloft Forecasts: 6, 12, and 24-hour forecasts of wind direction, speed, and temperatures for selected altitudes to 53,000 feet MSL.


