Sums of money totaling \$82,500 in one section were among a large number of designations made by the late Helene Bartlett, Muscatine, to Muscatine people, in a will filed for probate on Tuesday in Muscatine County district court.

Residents of various other parts of the U.S. were named in the document.

The following persons included under one section: L.D. Krueger, Muscatine, \$5,000; Elmer P. Steinmetz, Muscatine, \$5,000; Mary Ann Laurans, Providence, Rhode Island, \$10,000 and a mink coat an engagement ring; William S. Block, Marshalltown, Iowa, \$10,000; Ellen Block, Muscatine, persian lamb coat; Shirley R. Glatstein, Muscatine, \$50,000; Wanda Burr, Muscatine, \$6,000; Helen Almandinger, Muscatine, \$1,500.

Eleven persons of Muscatine and the middle-west were included in another section, to receive amounts totaling \$9,500.


Sums of \$1,000 each were left to Florence Schrier and Myron Hoffman, both of New York, and to Faye Newsome, of Long Beach, Cal.

A large number of organizations were named, including the following:

Trinity Episcopal Church for a memorial fund of the Bartlett Family, \$1,000; Temple Emanuel, Davenport, \$1,000; Lutheran Homes, \$500; Muscatine County cancer fund, \$1,000; United Jewish Appeal, New York, \$5,000; Jewish Hadassah Society of Muscatine, \$1,000; B'Nai Moses Synagogue of Muscatine, \$1,000; B'Nai Brith Society of Muscatine, \$1,000; Salvation Army of Muscatine, \$500; and Benjamin Hershey Memorial Hospital, Muscatine, \$5,000. Many other organizations in the U.S. were named for large sums.

Various personal possessions and property also were designated.

Mrs. Bartlett, widow of the late Howard M. Bartlett of Muscatine, died May 14 at the Hershey convalescent home in Muscatine. She had no children, and was preceded in death by her husband, four sisters and two brothers.



### Unloading New Generator

Workmen are at the Muscatine Municipal Water and Electric power plant unloading a 150-ton, 66-megawatt General Electric generator for the plant addition. Operation of the addition is scheduled to begin in October of 1969. The generator was shipped from Massachusetts. A turbine which will run the generator also has arrived, but in considerably smaller components. Power Service Co. of Minneapolis is under contract to unload and install the turbo-generator. Total cost of the addition will be \$13.5 million, and of the turbo-generator, \$2,153,787. (Journal Photo)

### Area Students To Graduate From Dubuque

DUBUQUE — Noel K. Moody, son of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Moody of Muscatine, and Robert C. Barkhurst, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter B. Barkhurst of Atalissa, will be among the graduates honored at the commencement exercises of the Liberal Arts College of the University of Dubuque on May 26. Moody and Barkhurst are members of the largest graduating class in Dubuque's history, numbering 141 candidates for graduating.

Commencement activities will begin on May 25, with a reception at Lindsay Walk from 8 to 10 p.m. Baccalaureate services will be at 9 a.m., May 26, in Westminster Presbyterian church. The commencement convocation will begin at 2:30 p.m. in McCormick gymnasium. Dr. William G. Chalmers, President of the University of Dubuque, will give the graduation address.
