An Air Force jet especially designed for Vietnam-type warfare, the A-37 light ground-attack aircraft, will be exhibited from June 18 to June 20, at the foot of Ripley St. in Davenport. The A-37 is a modification of the T-37, a primary Air Force jet pilot trainer for more than 10 years. The aircraft to be displayed here has been painted to depict a camouflaged A-37 on one side and the T-38 trainer on the other.

To accomplish this mission the A-37 has been given nearly three times the power of the trainer model through the installation of two General Electric J-85-174 turbojets, increasing the aircraft's thrust from 2,050 to 5,700 pounds. This provides a speed range, of 138 to 438 m.p.h. with no external stores.

A variety of conventional armament can be carried on the A-37, utilizing eight wing pylons, and a 7.62-mm minigun, capable of firing 6,000 rounds per minute, is mounted in the nose. The plane can carry 4,855 pounds of ordnance.

The A-37 has a range of more than 1,400 miles and can be refueled in flight. Its maximum distance is obtained by using single-engine cruise control procedures. This one-engine capability makes it possible for the aircraft to complete its mission even after losing an engine on take-off.

The A-37 will be on display from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily. Admission is free.


PTA Officers Are Elected
