


Activities of Area Club Women in May

APLINGTON — The Aplington Woman's Clubs have made arrangements for the children of the community to participate in the Red Cross Water Safety program at the Ackley pool. Aplington's first lesson will begin June 24 with lessons on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The lesson hours will begin at 9 and 9:45 a.m. for the summer. They will continue for six weeks with a total of 18 lessons. Transportation will again be provided by the Aplington Community School buses which will leave from the school. There will be only one additional stop at the Austinville corner. The fee per child for transportation is \$3.75. There is an additional cost of \$1.25 per child. This will go towards the total pool fee of \$3.00 per child. The balance of this swim program will be paid by Aplington Woman's Club, the city of Aplington, and the Aplington Community School. There will be no basket service at the pool. Each child should provide a bag for his or her swimming suit and towel. Each person is responsible for his own clothing. It is suggested that each student take his clothing out on the deck with him to avoid loss or theft. Anyone interested in junior life saving and water safety courses should contact the pool manager, Mrs. Tobe Frerichs Ackley. Students taking these courses must furnish their own transportation. The pool fee of \$1.25 must be paid to the swim program committee as soon as arrangements are made. The swim program committee includes Mmes. 


