Maynard Gets Big U.S. Loan

MAYNARD — Rep. John Culver, 2nd District, met with the Maynard Town Council Monday evening in a special session and announced that an additional grant and loan of about \$134,000 from the Federal Housing Administration has become available to the town.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$300,000, leaving about \$2,000 to be paid by the town.

The \$134,000 is an additional grant and loan. Earlier funds provided the difference between this sum and the balance.

Nichols Construction Co. of Dyersville is expected to start work by Sept. 1, and complete the project during the spring of 1965.

Car-Bike Crash Injures Youth At Charles City

CHARLES CITY — Dennis Riggs, 15, of Charles City was reported in "good" condition Tuesday at the Charles City hospital with injuries suffered when his bicycle was struck by a car Monday evening.
