# Mayor Raps Lack Of Public Shelters

CHARLES CITY — Mayor Harry Brenton Friday endorsed a storm warning system for Iowa towns emphasizing the need for shelters along with the system.

"It seems foolish to discuss alarms without providing shelter," Mayor Brenton said.

"For instance, we had an 80-unit home for the elderly project here without one single basement or shelter. It was government built and supervised.

"It's inexcusable that there are no shelters provided."

State Civil Defense Director George Orr said Thursday that "some confusion" existed among local civil defense officials when the storms hit Charles City, Maynard and Oelwein May 15.

"Local civil defense officials at first were not organized and did not know specifically who would be in command of emergency efforts and what the role of each official was."

Orr also said city officials have been reluctant to spend money on tornado warning systems.

He estimated Charles City could install a warning system of \$15,000 to \$18,000, with half the amount coming from federal funds.

Mayor Brenton agreed with the idea, but noted Charles City did receive advanced warning of the storm.

"The sheriff and highway patrolmen followed the storm into Charles City, broadcast-

ing warnings ahead of the storm. The local radio also assisted in broadcasting the storm's approach.

"With all the damage here, I think we're lucky more people weren't killed."

Brenton said the city council had been contemplating a shelter and warning system for the city hall before the storm.

"Now, there's no doubt about it. I think all public buildings should have shelters."

Meanwhile, cleanup crews here received assistance from a radio crew and 23 workers from Newton, two trucks and Britt and 10 volunteers from Wellsburg High School.

Mayor Brenton said he's pleased with cleanup progress.
