
Arctic Blast Chills Southeast Michigan following widespread damaging winds on Saturday night.

Decision Support Briefing Highlights



What	Where	Timing	Impacts
Very Cold Temperatures (5-10F)	All of Southeast Michigan	Tonight through Wednesday	Several thousand homes are out of power following last night's wind damage. Many residents could be without heat during a rough stretch of extreme cold
Dangerous Wind Chill Values (-10 to -15F)	All of Southeast Michigan	Tonight through Wednesday	Outdoor activities should be avoided when wind chills fall to dangerous levels such as -15F
1" + of Snow	Mainly south of I-69	Midnight to 1pm Monday	Limited visibility during morning commute; slick roads possible









Snow Amounts







1-2" of snow will accumulate in much of Southeast Michigan tonight through Monday.

MONDAY MORNING






Decision Support Briefing FORECASTED UPPER AIR SETUP
