



Today through Wednesday



- Winds will decrease as Sandy lifts toward Lake Ontario. Northerly wind gusts will decrease to 25 mph by tonight, except near Lake Huron where gusts will only decrease to 35 mph.
- Rain will taper off today, but showers will linger through Wed. New rainfall will be less than 0.25".


Hazards for Southeast MI



Last map update: Mon, Oct. 29, 2012 at 11:50:13 am EDT

- High Wind Warning until 1 PM: Huron, Sanilac, St Clair
- Wind Advisory until 1 PM: Rest of SE MI
- Lake Shore Flood Advisory: Bay, Tuscola, Huron, Sanilac, St Clair
- Low Water Advisory until 11am: Monroe
- Gale/Storm Warnings: Lakes Huron, St Clair and Erie.

GOES-East Imagery 8:30am Tuesday



- Sandy has moved well inland and has begun to weaken.
- Clouds and precipitation are rotating through Southeast Michigan this morning.

Summary

- Sandy will approach upstate New York by early Wednesday
- Winds will stay gusty through Wednesday, but will subside considerably during the day today, eventually dropping to 25 mph inland and 35 mph near Lake Huron.
- Impacts of the Wind Warning/Advisory include:
 - Power outages
 - Damage to trees and small structures
 - Travel difficulties
 - Expires at 1 pm EDT
- Potential impacts of the Lakeshore Flood Advisory include:
 - Coastal erosion from wave activity
 - Flooding of roads, homes and businesses
 - Expires at 8 pm EDT
