





# Tuesday Forecast




- Rain from tonight into Tuesday evening.
- Heaviest rain will be late tonight into Tuesday morning and then again late Tuesday afternoon and evening.
- Northeast winds gusting over 30 mph but will likely exceed 40 mph closer to Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron.

# Tuesday Night Forecast




- Rain changes to snow Tuesday night.
- Chance for accumulating snow across all of Southeast Michigan
- 1 to 3 inches of snow possible from the hills that extend from Huron to Lenawee County, and points west.
- Gusty Northeast winds will become Northwest.




- Forecast for tonight through Wednesday.

# Chance of Exceeding an Inch of Precipitation


## Tonight

12h PQPF (%) thru 11/29/2011 06EST




## Tuesday

12h PQPF (%) thru 11/29/2011 18EST




## Tuesday Night

# Snow Forecast



- Image is a probability of exceeding 4 inches.
- 1 to 3 inches expected for areas along and west of a Bad Axe to Adrian line.
- Chance for higher amounts if the colder air filters into Southeast Michigan faster Tuesday evening.
- Temperatures will be in the lower 30s during the snow event.
- Despite gusty winds, heavy and wet snow should not blow or drift much.

# Summary

- Rain to fall from tonight through Tuesday evening
- Heaviest rain last tonight into Tuesday evening
- Rainfall amounts between 1 and 2 inches
- Many locations could exceed 2 inches of rainfall
- Chance for flooding area streams, creeks, and rivers
- Wind gusts in excess of 30 mph, but could exceed 40 mph in the counties near Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron
- Rain changes to snow Tuesday night. 1 to 3 inches possible along and west of a Bad Axe to Adrian line.
