


### ...Winter Storm To Impact the Region Tonight and Sunday...




- Zone 1: Major winter storm. Details on Page 2
- Zone 2: Transition area. Details on Page 3
- Zone 3: Mostly rain tonight, light snow on Sunday. Details on Page 4

- Rain today will change to snow this evening over northern Missouri, where significant snow accumulations are possible. Snow will taper off Sunday afternoon.
- Mostly rain expected near and south of the Missouri River, with minor snow accumulations possible Sunday morning.
- Temperatures will be very close to freezing, *and a very small deviation in temperatures could mean the difference between several inches of snow and little to no snowfall for some areas.*

**ZONE 1:** Including Maryville, Albany, Bethany, Princeton, Milan, Unionville and Kirksville

**WINTER STORM WARNING UNTIL 9 PM SUNDAY (pink)**




**SNOW AMOUNTS:** 6" to 10" with the highest amounts near the Iowa border. Locally higher amounts are possible over northeast MO.

**TIMING:** Rain mixed with snow at times this afternoon becoming all snow this evening. Snow will taper off Sunday afternoon


**WINDS:** From the southeast at 5-10 mph this evening, becoming gusty from the north on Sunday at 25 to 35 MPH. Significant blowing and drifting possible

**CONFIDENCE:** Medium. If temperatures are slow to fall below freezing, snowfall amounts may only be in the 4" to 6" range.



**ZONE 2:** Including Troy, St. Joseph, Cameron, Trenton, Chillicothe, Brookfield and Moberly

**WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY UNTIL 9 PM SUNDAY (purple)**




**SNOW AMOUNTS:** 2" to 6"

**TIMING:** Rain mixed with snow at times this afternoon becoming all snow this evening and overnight. Snow will taper off Sunday afternoon

**WINDS:** From the southeast at 5-10 mph this evening, becoming gusty from the north on Sunday at 25 to 35 MPH

**CONFIDENCE:** LOW. If temperatures are slow to fall below freezing overnight, snowfall amounts may struggle to reach 2". On the other hand if temperatures fall faster than expected, amounts could exceed 6" and an upgrade to a warning may be needed.



**ZONE 3:** Including the Kansas City metro area, Richmond, Carrollton, Paola, Harrisonville, Warrensburg, Clinton, Sedalia, Boonville

**SNOW AMOUNTS:** Generally 1" or less. Up to 2" possible north of the Missouri River

**TIMING:** Rain will continue overnight, and will switch over to snow late tonight and early Sunday morning.

**WINDS:** From the southeast at 5-10 mph this evening, becoming gusty from the north on Sunday at 20 to 30 MPH

**CONFIDENCE:** MEDIUM. Snow amounts may be slightly higher if temperatures fall below freezing sooner than expected, but are unlikely to exceed 3" north of the Missouri River and 2" to the south. Conversely, only trace amounts of snow are possible if temperatures haven't fallen below freezing by 9 AM Sunday.
