




January 2011 Weather in Review

The charts below show the daily highs and lows for January 2011 at Austin, Del Rio, and San Antonio.




**Temperature Summary for Del Rio Area
Jan 1, 2011 - Jan 31, 2011**




Observed daily maximum and minimum temperatures are connected by dark blue bars.

Summary of January 2011 Weather

Mostly sunny days, with clear and cold nights, came to South Central Texas on January 1st and 2nd in wake of a cold front December 31st. Clouds came on Monday the 3rd, as overrunning cloudiness increased, followed by light rain the 4th. A dry Pacific Front briefly brought sunny and mild conditions on the 5th, when highs rose to the 60s to low and mid 70s. More clouds returned Friday the 7th through the morning and afternoon of Saturday the 8th, ahead of a disturbance that brought a round of showers and thunderstorms the night of the 8th to the morning of the 9th. The best rains since September came with this storm system. As the storm system moved east on the 9th, colder air spilled across the region and set up several days of cold daytime highs. The coldest daytime highs for January 2011 were from the 10th to the 14th, except for locations west and north of Uvalde, where at Rocksprings and Del Rio the coldest days were from the 11th to the 14th. Highs were in the upper 30s to mid 40s at most locations. Further west near Del Rio, where more sunny days came in January, daytime highs in the low 70s the 9th changed to the 50s the 10th and 40s the 11th to 13th. On the 14th highs across South Central Texas were in the 40s to near 50.

Rainy conditions came the weekend of the 15th and 16th, with highs mostly in the 50s, except for Del Rio, where drier conditions and more sunshine allowed highs to rise to 71 Sunday the 16th. After morning clouds and patchy fog on the 17th, partly cloudy skies in the afternoon and milder conditions allowed highs to rise to the upper 50s to the 60s. On the 18th to the 19th, south and southeast winds brought overnight clouds and patchy early morning fog to partly cloudy afternoons, with highs in the 60s and 70s.

The brief warming trend the 18th and 19th ended the 20th. A fast moving cold front swept across South Central Texas the morning of Thursday, January 20th. Scattered light rain showers formed from Austin to San Antonio and moved quickly east and out of South Central Texas in the afternoon. Colder, drier and windy conditions in the day followed the morning cold front on the 20th. The north winds brought a mix of polar and arctic air. The lows on Friday the 21st and Saturday the 22nd were among the lowest for January 2011, with most locations showing lows in the in the Upper Teens to Near 20 over the Hill Country to Around 20 to the 20s over adjacent parts of South Central Texas. South and southeast winds returned on Saturday the 22nd, and were followed by increasing low clouds in the early morning on Sunday the 23rd. A slow moving cold front moved in from the north the 23rd. Mostly sunny and warmer conditions followed Monday the 24th. Sunny days came the 25th and the 26th, with cold early morning lows and mild afternoons. A warming trend followed the 27th through the end of the month. The warmest days of the month came Sunday, January 30th, and Monday, January 31st, when highs rose to the 70s to low 80s. A strong arctic cold front brought much colder weather on February 1st.
