

Red Flag Warning This Afternoon

...Storms Possible Wednesday Night through Friday...




Highlights

- Breezy SW winds and very low humidity will lead to critical fire danger across the area this afternoon. A red flag warning is in effect for extreme northeast KS and far northwest MO, but very high fire danger is expected area-wide
- Several rounds of thunderstorms are possible Wednesday night through Friday. The threat of severe weather is fairly low at this time for Wednesday night's activity, but a few strong storms can't be ruled out.

Humidity


Very low humidity will be the primary impetus for fire danger this afternoon. By 3 PM, relative humidity is expected to drop into the 15-25% range throughout the area. The lowest values are expected across extreme northeast KS and far northwest MO.



Winds

southwest winds will increase to 12-15 mph this afternoon, and will occasionally gust to 20-25 mph. Highest wind speeds are expected across portions of NW MO.

Storms Possible Wednesday Night



A few storms are possible Wednesday night, primarily after midnight in far northwest MO and northeast KS. At this time, the severe potential looks fairly low, but a few strong storms cannot be ruled out. The SPC Day 3 slight risk denotes where there might be a possibility of a strong storm or two late Wednesday night.
