




# Hazardous Weather Briefing

## One More Round of Rainfall Expected this Week



- 1-2 inches of rain expected Thursday through Saturday
- The ground is still saturated, but rainfall will be spread out over 48 hours with runoff being gradual and less of a flood threat.
- The Flood Watch that was in effect into today has been cancelled.

# Diminishing Flood Potential Summary




- **One more period of rainfall is expected from Thursday morning through Saturday.**
- **Ground is still saturated due to recent heavy rains. Additional rain may still cause some creeks, streams, and some downstream river points to run full. At this time, rivers over Eastern Kentucky are not expected to reach flood stage late in the week or this weekend.**
- **Most rainfall will occur in the northern portions of Eastern Kentucky with up to 2 inches expected, with an inch or less to the southeast.**
- **The main axis of the forecasted heavy rainfall has shifted to the northwest and the expected rain will fall over a longer duration. This will result in a lower threat of flooding.**
- **Ponding of water and flooded low crossing and low water bridges would be possible at some point.**

Forecast Rainfall 8 AM Thursday, March 12 through 8 AM Friday, March 13th






# Flood Potential: Rainfall Concerns

## Prepare for high water now if you live in a flood prone area!




Have a NOAA weather Radio? Is it plugged in and properly programmed?
