



Accumulations



Winter Snow Warning and Winter Weather Advisory **In Effect Until 4 am Sat**



- Main accumulation will occur *this evening through Midnight.*
- Snow amounts of 3-6 inches are likely from parts of southern Indiana to the northern Bluegrass region of KY.
- 1-4 inches are likely along the Interstate 64 corridor.
- 1-2 inches are likely farther south across central Ky.
- Snow may be heavy at times...restricting visibilities.





Expected Impacts

Timing: Rain will change to snow by mid evening across central and east-central Kentucky. The heaviest snow will fall from early evening to around midnight, with a diminishing trend after midnight.

Road Impacts: Afternoon snow in southern Indiana will work south of the Ohio River by early evening, with accumulation expected on untreated roadways as temperatures fall into the lower 30s. This, along with reduced visibility in areas of heavier snowfall will result in negative travel impacts for this evening's commute in the Louisville metro area, and for late commuters in Lexington. Negative travel impacts will become more likely across southern Kentucky this evening. Travel conditions are expected to remain hazardous overnight through into early Saturday morning.
