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Current Short Term Thinking

This Afternoon: Clouds are expected to partially clear across southwestern Indiana and west-central Kentucky. Showers and thunderstorms are expected to quickly redevelop. The area most favorable for thunderstorm develop will be mainly across areas south of the Ohio River in Kentucky and generally east of Interstate 65. Storms will initially start out as scattered and then begin to congeal into bowing line segments as they move eastward.

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Expected Weather Threats

Hazardous Weather Threats Expected Sunday Afternoon:

1. Damaging wind gusts in excess of 60 MPH.
2. Potential for large hail (larger than 1 inch).
3. Isolated Tornadoes
4. Torrential rainfall with isolated Flash Flooding
5. Intense cloud to ground lightning

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


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SPC Severe Weather Outlook

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
