Outlook for 2011-2012 Holiday Season

Updated: December 29, 2011

Near or slightly above normal temperatures are expected across South Florida through Monday, before cooler air arrives again during the first week of 2012. A high pressure ridge over northern Florida will allow easterly low-level flow to persist, keeping warm temperatures and a slight chance of showers in the forecast through Monday, mainly along the east coast. By early next week, another cold front will move across the Florida peninsula, which will bring a cooler airmass to the area by mid-end of the week.

A useful tool for looking further ahead in the forecast is the extended 6-10 day outlook issued by the [Climate Prediction Center](#). This outlook calls for a slightly enhanced likelihood of near-normal temperatures and above normal precipitation through New Year's Day.

Stay updated with the latest forecasts for south Florida and across the country as we approach the holiday period by going to the NWS Miami website at weather.gov/southflorida and clicking on the map in the front page for a detailed point forecast. You can also get a forecast for another part of the country by typing in a zip code or city and state in the white bar at the top left of the front page.
