Wednesday, February 25, 2015 3 PM

## Hazard Risk:

- Light Snow or Flurries Late Tonight & Thursday Morning.
- Bitter Cold Wind Chills Below Zero Thursday morning through Friday Morning.
- Potential of Accumulating Winter Precipitation this weekend into early next week.

## Outlook:

Light snow will develop across central Missouri late this evening into the overnight hours and spread southeast. Up to an inch of snow may accumulate mainly across central portions of south central Missouri or generally east of Highway 65 and north of Highway 60. Northwesterly winds up to 35 mph may cause blowing snow and reduce visibilities Thursday morning.

\*\*\*Closely monitor the forecast for this weekend and early next week for the potential of accumulating winter precipitation\*\*\*



## General Timeline



## Areas & Timing:

- Developing central MO along and north of Hwy 54 around midnight then spreading southeast to the I-44 corridor by 3 AM
- Most of the snow with this event will occur from midnight tonight til 9 AM Thursday

## Impact:

- Slick roads possible
- Travel conditions could vary significantly over short distances
- Visibility briefly near 1 mile or less in heavier snow
- Falling temperatures and bitter cold wind chills developing Thursday morning.
