




# Situation Report

National Weather Service Springfield, MO



**Issued:** 7/24/13 11:00 AM      **Subject:** Severe Weather Possible This Afternoon and Evening  
**Hazards:** Large Hail, Damaging Winds and Frequent Lightning  
**Current Watches/Advisories/Warnings:** Severe Weather Watches Expected by Late Afternoon

**Thunderstorm Outlook for Sunday**



**Risk:** Severe thunderstorms with damaging winds up to 80 mph, large hail to the size of golf balls frequent lightning, torrential rainfall and localized flooding

**Timing:** 5 PM to 11 PM. Storms will initially impact the Interstate 49 corridor between 5 and 7 PM then reach the Highway 65 corridor between 7 and 9 PM. The storms will impact the eastern Ozarks during the late evening hours.

**Impact:** Damage to trees and powerlines. Some structural damage cannot be ruled out with the potential of winds in excess of 70 mph. Outdoor venues including sporting events will be impacted.


**Prepare Now:** Prepare for rapidly developing storms with damaging winds and hail. Expect the issuance of severe weather watches and warnings.

**Outlook:** The storms will move east out of the area tonight. Additional severe weather possible tomorrow.


