

Annual Summary:

Rains that began in the Fall of 2000 continued into the Winter across West Central Texas...helping to end drought conditions. Below normal rains fell in the Spring however, and with a dry Summer the drought appeared to have come back. In mid-August though, the upper level high pressure system that normally suppresses shower and thunderstorm development broke, and welcome rains fell across much of the area. Above normal rains occurred through November. The heaviest rainfall of 2 to 5 inches (with local amounts up to 10 inches in southeast Kimble county) occurred from November 14th to 15th as an upper low stagnated over Far West Texas and New Mexico. The rain produced moderate river flooding on the Llano and South Llano Rivers. Some yearly rainfall totals from Coop and ASOS sites in the San Angelo HSA:
