


Approaching Mountain Winter Storm

A fast moving pacific storm system will bring snow, strong winds, and blowing snow to the mountains Sunday and Sunday Night. Mountain travel will be slow and hazardous!



Snow Amounts



Key Points

- Snow begins:
 - Western Grand/Jackson counties – early Sunday morning
 - Front Range Mountains/Rocky Mountain National Park into Summit County – late Sunday morning
- Dangerous and very slow travel conditions with heavy snow and blowing snow
- Strong winds and cold wind chill readings
- Stay up to date with latest road conditions and travel restrictions at www.cotrip.org
- Snow and wind diminishes:
 - Monday through the day, but only gradually

Impacts

- Dangerous and very slow travel conditions
 - Road closures possible, including I-70 through Summit County from Vail Pass through the Eisenhower Tunnel
 - Heavy snow, blowing snow, and poor visibilities
 - Snow-packed and icy roads with hazardous travel
- Strong winds and cold wind chill readings
 - Northwest winds 15-30 mph below 10 thousand feet
 - Northwest winds 25-40 mph with gusts to 60 mph
 - Wind Chill Readings 0°F to -25°F
 - Visibilities near zero in open areas
