





Wednesday and Wednesday Night Forecast




- Rain from tonight through Wednesday and into Thursday.
- Heaviest rain will be Wednesday afternoon and evening.
- Northeast winds gusting over 30 mph but will likely exceed 40 mph closer to Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron.




Rainfall Forecast


24h QPF thru 10/20/2011 06EST





24h PQPF (%) thru 10/20/2011 06EST



- Left image is the rainfall forecast for Wednesday and Wednesday night.
- Right is image is the chance of exceeding 2 inches of rain Wednesday and Wednesday night



Wind Forecast



Summary

- Rain to fall from tonight through Thursday
- Heaviest rain on Wednesday afternoon and evening
- Rainfall amounts between 1 and 2 inches
- Many locations could exceed 2 inches of rainfall
- Chance for flooding area streams, creeks, and rivers
- Localized flood threat in cities and metro areas
- Wind gusts in excess of 30 mph, but could exceed 40 mph in the counties near Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron
