# Winter Weather



As with severe weather, winter weather in North Texas can be just as dangerous. Ice and snow can bring travel to a halt and make driving extremely dangerous. Stay ahead of the winter weather by checking the website for up to the minute information on Winter Weather watches, warnings, and advisories.

# Severe Weather

When the threat for severe weather is high, the National Weather Service in Fort Worth will provide additional information to web users. Additional graphical images will be provided and a SPECIAL WEATHER MODE will be enabled on the website. A flashing tab will provide the link to access this special weather mode. Just click on the flashing tab!



National Weather Service Weather Radio (NWR) is a service that broadcasts on seven VHF band frequencies ranging from 162.400 MHz to 162.550 MHz. These frequencies are outside the normal AM or FM broadcast bands found on the average home radio.

These broadcasts originate from your local National Weather Service office. As the **Voice of the National Weather Service**, weather radio provides continuous broadcasts of the latest weather information. Broadcasts can be heard as far away as 40 miles from the antenna site. However, the effective range depends on several factors, including the terrain, quality of the receiver, and current weather conditions.




The forecast for your area can be obtained by clicking on the Interactive Map on the homepage. Forecasts for anywhere in the United States, Puerto Rico, and all American territories can be obtained by inputting a valid zip code into the box at the top left portion of the page.




The interactive map on the homepage always has up to the minute information on severe weather watches, warnings, and advisories. A list of valid severe weather products in effect for your area can be obtained by clicking on the area of the map in which you live.



Radar and satellite imagery is available for anywhere in the country. Once you've clicked on the interactive map, these thumbnail images will be available for you to click on. The radar images are updated every 5 to 10 minutes. Satellite images are updated about every 30 minutes.



Click on the map for a local forecast or input a zip code in the box at the top left for a forecast anywhere in the U.S.



Additional links are provided to the right of the map.

Submit storm reports online by clicking on the tab above the interactive map. These reports are received at the NWS within minutes.

Hourly graphs of weather forecast information are also available.
