

# Overview – Thursday Night Through Friday




- Arctic cold front will be southeast of the area, with colder air pushing into the Ohio Valley Thursday night and Friday.
- Low pressure over the Southeast, coupled with an upper-level disturbance over Arkansas will trigger wintry precipitation
- Sleet, freezing rain, and snow will spread southeast from southern Indiana Thursday night into central Kentucky Friday.








# Expected Accumulations Thu. Night-Fri. Night





# Heavy Rain Overview – Thursday through Friday Night



- This storm system will dump heavy rain, especially over central Kentucky
- 2-3 inches are expected in a wide band stretching from Bowling Green through Lexington
- At this time, it is forecast that no major river flooding will occur, but localized flooding is possible
