NWS Springfield Forecast Highlights

What	Where	Timing	Impacts
Strong to Severe Thunderstorms	Best Chances over southeast KS and western MO.	Late afternoon and tonight. Best chances 6 pm- 2 am.	SPC Slight Risk. Hail and damaging winds the main risks.
Additional Chances For Severe Weather Tue Night/Wed	The entire region. Some focus for better chances over southeast Kansas and Western Missouri.	Tue evening through Wed morning. Timing in some question.	All modes of severe weather possible early (tornadoes, hail, damaging winds). May evolve into a line of storms with time.
Heavy Rain Tue Night/Wed	Over the entire region. Some focus for better chances over central and south central MO.	Tue Night lasting into Wed. Timing in some question	Soils are already moist. Training storms may produce isolated flash flooding. Longer term flooding possible.
