Summary: Both the San Juan and St. Thomas ASOS sites reported below normal rainfall for the month of February. The San Juan ASOS reported 1.74 inches for the month of February... 0.56 inches less than the normal of 2.30 inches. At the Truman Field in St. Thomas, the reported amount was 1.06 inches which was 0.45 inches less than their normal of 1.51 inches.

The only event for this month was a short period of localized rainfall from some scattered showers and thunderstorms that moved through the forecast area. These showers were triggered by some low level moisture interacting with an upper level trough that moved through Puerto Rico in mid-February.

In deference to this rainfall on February 17th, Urban and Small Stream Advisories were issued for an area extending from Ponce (central PR) to San Sebastian (northwest). Rainfall from this event ranged from less than an inch to over 2 inches with some isolated amounts estimated to be greater than 3 inches.

As a whole, February was quiet with no forecast locations approaching flood stage.
